



Danmarks Nationalbank issues new 200-krone banknote

The new 200-krone banknote, which has Knippelsbro as its face motif, will be issued on Tuesday, 19 October 2010.

The new banknote series is described in more detail on Danmarks Nationalbank's website, www.nationalbanken.dk, under "Notes and Coins".

Low numbers

The banknotes will have sequence no. A0xxxx. The sequence number is in the lower right-hand corner. The individual serial numbers of the banknotes are stated on the left-hand side just below the denomination.

It should be noted that the serial number is six digits followed by a letter. While several banknotes will have the same combination of digits, the end letter will vary, making the serial number unique.

The serial numbers will indicate that the banknotes are from the first batch.

It will not be possible to order specific numbers. The banknotes are distributed as orders are received. The banknotes are supplied in acid-free plastic pockets.

Last edition of old 200-krone banknote

In addition, 200-krone banknotes of the last edition of the current series can be ordered. These banknotes have sequence number C408XX.

Sales open on 19 October 2010

The banknotes can be ordered at the website of Royal Danish Mint, www.royalmint.dk. Sales open on Tuesday, 19 October.

Both new and old 200-krone banknotes will be sold at face value. To cover the considerable administration involved a handling fee of kr. 200 including VAT will be charged per 10 banknotes - in the same way as for sales of Faroese banknotes.

Orders are limited to a maximum of 10 banknotes per fee, but may contain a combination of banknotes from the old, the new series and the Faroese series.
