



New 500-krone banknote from Danmarks Nationalbank

The new 500-krone banknote, with The bridge Dronning Alexandrines Bro as its motif, will be issued on Tuesday, 15 February 2011.

Low numbers

The banknotes will have sequence number A0 xxxx. The sequence number can be found in the lower right-hand corner. The serial number of each banknote is printed on the left-hand side just below the denomination.

The serial number consists of 6 digits followed by a letter. While several banknotes may have the same combination of digits, the end letter will vary, making the serial number unique. The serial numbers will indicate that the banknotes are from the first batch.

It will not be possible to order specific numbers. The banknotes are distributed as orders are received. The banknotes are supplied in acid-free plastic pockets.

Last edition of the old 500-krone banknote

From 15 February 2011 it will also be possible to purchase banknotes from the last edition of the old 500-krone banknote. These banknotes have sequence no. B808xx.

Both new and old 500-krone banknotes will be sold at face value. To cover the administration involved, a handling fee of DKK 200 including VAT will be charged per 10 banknotes – in the same way as for sales of Faroese banknotes.

An order may include several banknotes from both series and from the Faroese series, but the handling fee will be charged for every 10 banknotes ordered.

On top of the handling fee come the postage costs for deliveries from the Royal Danish Mint.

Purchase the new 500-krone banknote

To order the banknotes, go to the website of the Royal Danish Mint, www.royalmint.dk. Orders are accepted from Tuesday, 15 February 2011.

Facts:

Together with the 100-krone and 200-krone banknotes, the 500-krone banknote is the one most frequently used in ATMs in Denmark.

Just over 28 million of the 163 million Danish banknotes in circulation are 500-krone banknotes.

This denomination makes up around one fourth of the total value of Danish banknotes in circulation, which is just over DKK 56 billion.

Special editions of new 10-krone and 20-krone coins

To commemorate the 70th birthday of Queen Margrethe II in April 2010, a special coin was minted, with a new portrait of the Queen created by the sculptor Lis Nogel.

Obverse

It has been decided to use this portrait on 10-krone and 20-krone coins in future. At the same time, the reverse of the coins will be altered. In the new design, drawn by Ronny Andersen, Royal Heraldic Painter, the three Danish lions (leopards) will be depicted in a traditional coat of arms under the Danish crown. The denomination will be stated below the coat of arms.

Reverse

This design bears some resemblance to the 1-krone and 2-krone coins minted under King Frederik IX in the period 1947-59.

However, the coat of arms has become more prominent as its background has been given a distinctive structure.

The newly designed 10-krone and 20-krone coins can be found in the 2011 Coin Set for Children and will also be included in the ordinary 2011 Coin Set, which will be issued in the autumn.

To mark the new design of the two coins, the Royal Danish Mint is offering collectors special editions of the coins.

Special dies

The dies used for these coins have first been sand blast and then glass blast. Using this technique gives the coins a uniform, silky smooth surface corresponding to the engraved elements on proof versions of coins.

The coins have been minted in a special medal minting press using several strokes to achieve a high quality.

The collector's editions of the new 10-krone and 20-krone coins will be sold as sets at a price of DKK 125 per set, including VAT.

The coins will be supplied in plastic capsules in a small plastic bag, which will also contain a brief description of the various 10-krone and 20-krone coins in the current coin series.

The special editions of the new 10-krone and 20-krone coins can be ordered in the period 15-22 February 2011.
